JAB ANSTOETZ and Studio Aisslinger have collaborated to create SHAPES. The acoustic panels not only dampen sound, but also create an interplay of light and shadow in the spaces in which they're used. KABOOM is a sturdy statement chair that can be used indoors or out. Its chunky style isn't just about looks: the thicker the hollow forms on the rotationally moulded chair, the sturdier it is. Designed by Studio Roderick Vos for FATBOY, the chair is made entirely from recycled polyethylene and comes in six pastel colours.
