


Elica

The Pearl cooker hood from specialist design company Elica is a bowl-shaped hanging unit, supplied in a white glass finish. The design recycles air through integrated aluminium grease and charcoal filters with potential air extraction rates of 650 cubic metres per hour. A neon light and remote control panel deliver both convenience and a stunning visual impression, and with a width of 80cm the Pearl comes with an optional 2.5m cable extension to hang from the highest ceilings.


Quadrant Carpets
